These letters were received with such joy by both residents and pupils alike. To further sow a smile, our junior governors promoted the growing of sunflowers by every class in the school for the purpose of planting in Admiral Court gardens. A strong connection between

generations was made. A beautiful sunflower art project has also been undertaken to include in Admiral Court.
