Dear parents, carers and children



# **Expectations for Excellence**

Regular attendance at school is very important for children to achieve the best they can as well as develop and maintain their personal social relationships.

## Reporting an absence

If your child is away from school you MUST telephone Mrs O'Connor in the school office on 01702509205, on the first day, before 9.15 am, to give an explanation of the absence, and any subsequent days thereafter. If you fail to do this the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

#### Holidays during Term Time

From September 2013 School
Attendance Legislation has stated that a request from a parent to take their child, of compulsory school age, out of school during term time can only be granted in exceptional circumstances and will not normally be authorised. Any parent requesting holiday during term time will be asked to attend a face to face meeting with Mrs Nicholls to discuss the request.

Darlinghurst School uniform is compulsory from Reception to Year 6.

Nursery children must wear a sky blue t-shirt (with or without logo), royal blue sweatshirt (with logo), black plain jogging bottoms (with or without logo).

Reception to year 5 girls must wear a sky blue polo shirt (with or without logo), royal blue v-neck jumper/cardigan (with logo), black plain tailored trousers/box pleat skirt/plain black pinafore

Reception to year 5 boys must wear a sky blue polo shirt (with or without logo), royal blue v-neck jumper (with logo), black plain tailored trousers/shorts

Year 6 children must wear a sky blue shirt with collar, royal blue V-neck jumper/cardigan (with logo), Academy tie, plain black trouser/shorts/box pleat skirt

All children need to wear plain black school shoes (no trainers or boots allowed), plain black or white socks, hair accessories must be small and in the school colours.

Assemblies were delivered this week to all pupils about bullying, why it sometimes happens, what they can do as pupils and what we are doing as a school.

At Darlinghurst we emphasise that bullying is identified as Several Times On Purpose (STOP) and the only way to stop bullying is to acknowledge that it happens and to encourage the person who is being bullied to speak out.

Bullying behaviour can be: physical pushing, poking, kicking and hitting.

Verbal bullying via name calling, sarcasm, spreading rumours, threats and teasing. As a school we challenge all forms of offensive or discriminatory language, homophobic and transphobic comments, sexist and sexual language, racist and faith targeted words.

Emotional bullying via isolation of others, tormenting, hiding things, threatening gestures, humiliation and excluding from games.

Online/cyber bullying is identified as posting on social media, sharing photos and sending nasty text messages.

We would like to emphasise to all children if they are a boy or a girl, old or young, big or small – bullying can make them feel rubbish and it is okay for them to be upset about it. The important thing is that they tell someone about it.
