Darlinghurst Academy Autumn Term Curriculum Highlights

Over the Autumn term we have provided our children with purposeful and engaging experiences and opportunities, developing skills, knowledge and attributes.

Our children have worked hard in core lessons (reading, writing and maths), engaging well in partner talk and learning, thinking about what they need to do next to be successful and achieve. They are demonstrating positive learning habits and developing growth mind sets, taking on challenges and taking risks. Here at Darlinghurst we place value on exemplifying behaviours for learning and teaching learning and life skills so that children are well equipped for learning.

During the Autumn Term learning and life skills have focused on 'learning together' and 'It's up to me'. Within our connected curriculum, lessons have been designed with purposeful starting and end points. There have been great, 'hooks' into learning, bringing learning alive. Creative and practical learning has encouraged children to explore, create and do, generating questions and moments of awe and wonder. Our children have shown that they are good thinkers, with enquiring minds. The connected curriculum has provided children to explore science, history and geography based topics through a variety of subjects. For example;

Year 6 have had a fascinating half term, deciding whether there has ever been a better time to live. Living during wartime and the Victorian era has not appealed, as times were tough, but surprisingly Roman Britain was popular, especially to the boys.

They had a wonderful trip to the Imperial War museum where the children were excited to take part in a documentary challenge. They were tasked with instructions from the depths of a jungle, via a video call, from a very busy TV producer. The children were then given IPhones to produce a short documentary based upon their experiences of the WW1 exhibit. The children were a credit to the school proving themselves to be totally engaged, respectful and full of empathy. The children showed empathy and respect to residents of Admiral court during 'afternoon Tea' reading their emotive poetry to our guests.

The nursery had fun decorating biscuits too and making marshmallow snowmen with the Residents of Admiral court too, filling the room with smiles and laughter. I continue to feel proud of our children and staff, especially when they represent our community and demonstrate a sense of belonging.

Our reception children have generated their own ideas and play spaces, creating new role play areas inside and outside, linked to their topic, 'people who help us'. They included a construction site and a hospital, with operating facilities. The children have enjoyed the latest addition of a home corner, complete with interaction TV and an adjoining utility room. The outside writing shed is being well used and is inspiring the children to mark make and practise writing their letters.

Year 1 have been explorers looking and designing maps to find our way around the school and local areas. We used atlases to find where Spain is located and looked at the similarities and differences between the two countries. The children have also enjoyed learning greetings in Spanish and have used ipads to film themselves performing and singing to 'Feliz Navidid'. The children have also been learning about seasonal changes and different types of plants, they used leaves they collected to make woodland creature collages.

In **Year 2** our children discovered a mysterious box containing items belonging to Samuel Pepys and ended the term immersed in creative learning by re-enacting the great fire of London with the Rainbow Theatre Company. The company commented on how knowledgeable the children were and how they could spot 'budding' actors in the making, so London West-end watch out!

Year 3 pretended to be archaeologists by excavating artefacts and using theses as clues for learning. They completed a science experiment to discover how things are preserved and learned about mummification with visiting Egyptian experts.

In **Year 4**, some of the pupils have been learning about our solar system as part of their science topic course. The children have learnt all about the planets, how they differ from our own and what conditions make Earth habitable and others not so welcoming! To bring the learning alive they have focused on one of our nearest neighbours, Mars. This has been especially topical due to the recent news events and the arrival of the space probe. The children discussed whether they thought there was life on Mars and gave their reasons. In addition, they discussed what the word 'alien' means and how many things are really aliens as they are not in their natural environment.

The theme of the 'Titanic' inspired our **Year 5** children to consider class system in Edwardian Britain and how it has changed forever since First World War. The children visited the Southend museum, listening to talks on WW1 and viewed the exhibits with interest, asking questions about historical events and artefacts. We consider the social, moral, spiritual and emotional needs of our children, through a holistic approach in our daily lives and teaching. During the Autumn term we have considered the needs of others, safety in school and well-being, friendship and anti-bullying and diversity, through our PHSE lessons, academy wide themes and topics.

Across the academy we have considered cultural and religious festivals, key dates in history, such as 'Bonfire night' and 'Hannukah'. Our academy values and British values are exemplified through all that we do. They are promoted and celebrated through our actions. The Autumn term has seen children demonstrating tolerance of others and mutual respect, within examples such as: shaping the future, diversity and music, differences we can't see and odd socks. Rule of law and academy expectations and conduct have been shared, with recognition given to children who help others with their behaviour, through our house point system. Children have considered the liberty of others through topic based learning in history and english, along with academy-wide themed learning within black history month and the centenary of WW1. We follow a democratic process, with elections for our active citizens, casting democratic votes. Our children have taken responsibility for their posts and have shown commitment and pride. Our caring fundraisers, have raised money for charities, such as; children in need, Harp; considering those who are homeless and the Indee Trust, providing treasure boxes for children.

Discrete teaching has been given to topic, including the introduction of focused topic time, allowing children and staff develop practical skills in ICT, become scientific enquirers, consider culture and diversity and how to stay healthy.

Throughout the year we focus on developing healthy relationships, feelings and respect as part of our RSE provision. Additional lessons have touched upon keeping our bodies active and healthy, drugs and alcohol, gender stereotypes and e-safety.

Darlinghurst has participated in community events and competitions, within the wider community, visiting and hosting events. The Autumn Term has seen representatives in sporting events and the arts, with our children competing to a high standard and demonstrating 'sportsmanship' and 'comradery'. Our children sang with enthusiasm and passion at the Southend hospital, light switch on and to the residents of Admiral court.

We encourage children to develop their artistic flair, interests and talents in school and through our extended provision. Staff and visiting providers have given opportunity for children to participate in numerous clubs, developing their interests and skills in sports, arts, languages, music and much more!

The Autumn term has certainly been busy, including opportunities to share and celebrate with parents and carers. Shared learning and homework has supported the children's developments, including the parental engagement in events, such as; workshops, learning together 'reading' session and parent consultations. Celebratory events and community events has helped in strengthening relationships and building that sense of community and belonging. 
