#### **Junior Governors**

The Junior Governors are a group of children from Key Stage 1 and 2 who work together to make the school a better place. Much like Parliament, they are democratically elected by their peers and play a vital role in representing the views of all children at the school. By meeting, sharing ideas and completing activities throughout the year, the Junior Governor Team fulfil their role as active citizens, listening to suggestions from other pupils about ways in which to improve the school. They then provide this vital feedback to the teaching staff and the Principal. Some of the projects they have been involved in this year include ways in which to make lunchtimes even better, discussing their views on school uniform and lunches and creating artwork to share with Admiral Court.

#### Eco Committee

Caring for our environment is a huge part of daily life in our school, especially as it promotes our core value of belonging. Our Eco Committee, which consists of pupils from Years 1-6 work hard to promote eco-awareness across the school working towards our renewal of the Green Flag Award. We follow the Eco-schools programme, which covers 10 key areas in which we can protect our environment. This year we focused on waste, litter and the school grounds. We litter pick our school grounds, the nearby streets and Chalkwell Beach throughout the year. We have worked hard at planting trees, creating our own wildflower garden and improving our allotment area. We have continued to recycle paper, plastic bottles, plastic food wrappers, pens, ink cartridges and batteries and have taught the other children how best to do this. We have taken part in several national events including a Youth Climate Summit, the Great Big School Clean and Essex Green Day.

#### **Sports Committee**

The Sports Committee have worked really hard this year, making sure the children's voice is heard. With the PE team, they looked through the suggestion box and are planning to put some of the children's ideas into action next year, they also met with Kirk Edwards our SGO(School Games Organiser) to give him their thoughts on all things sport and PE. One of the Sports Committee's biggest successes this year was helping the PE department promote and run the #letgirlsplay campaign. Over 175 girls in our school

took part in this event and spent an afternoon joining in with a giant football tournament. The committee also ran a 'Bring and Buy' sale of unwanted sports equipment alongside the Eco Committee to raise money for the school. It was a great success and they are already planning another 'bigger' sale in the future.

# **Play Leaders**

The Play Leaders have been amazing this year, sharing their knowledge of playground games with a various amount of children. We have adapted groupings to make sure that some of our superstars go into the KS1 playground and make their experience of lunchtimes, amazing. Our aims for next year are to add to our playground equipment to add variety to playgrounds. The Play Leaders were treated to a trip for their commitment this year to Chalkwell Park.

# **Peer Mentors**

The Peer Mentors received training this year to arm them with the skills needed to support others. They have been incredibly helpful in supporting the work our pastoral team does at playtimes and lunchtimes.
