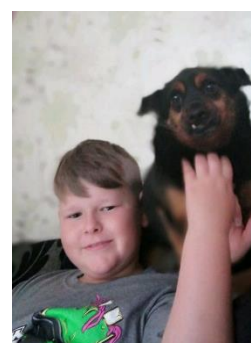

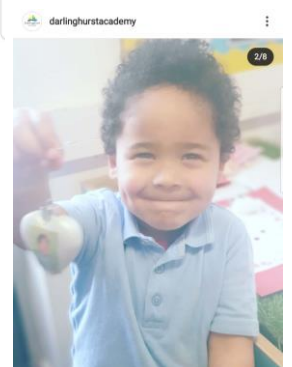

Mental Health Support

A recent report by the Mental Health Foundation supports a link between online use and poor mental health. As a school we are participating in the Mental Health and Well-being programme and with the work undertaken this week in school and the half-term holiday approaching this might be an ideal time to have that conversation with your child about who they are communicating with on-line – Do YOU know who your child is talking to online? Is their mental health at risk from excess use of image? There is a recognised link that excessive use can lead to feelings of anxiety, depression, shame, upset and even thoughts of suicide. We recognise that it can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online or who they might be speaking to. But talking regularly, like you would about their day at school, will help your



child feel relaxed and mean that when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. It can help to:

- reassure them that you're interested in their life, offline and online. Recognise that they'll be using the internet to research homework as well talking to their friends.
- ask your child to show you what they enjoy doing online or apps they're using so you can understand them.
- be positive but also open about anything you're worried about. You could say "I think this site's really good" or "I'm a little worried about things I've seen here."
- ask them if they're worried about anything, and let them know they can come to you.
- ask them about their friends online and how they know they are who they say they are.
- listen for the reasons why your child wants to use apps or site you don't think are suitable, so you can talk about these together.
- ask your child what they think's okay for children of different ages so they feel involved in the decision making.
- Remind them to think before posting photos and videos that can be used illegally. We are aware that there are online requests going around asking for children to send pictures of feet. Whilst this may seem innocent any information sent means that the person requesting now has your child's contact details
- Whenever using online devices, make sure that it has its privacy setting on. Avoid befriending or meeting people **you** don't **know** through the internet. Are they who they say they say they are?
