## Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

With the month of September now behind us, we are well and truly in full swing of being back into routines and learning. Thank you for completing our settling back to school survey and I will share the results with you over the coming weeks.

Children are engaging in lessons across the curriculum, clubs and events. Their enthusiasm is infectious and it is always a pleasure to see them in action and sharing their work. This week, I enjoyed watching our Reception children in a PE lesson and loved joining in the warm up 'bean game' too. Mr Felton and Mr Blewett developed their skills and techniques in movement and travel, including relay. In other PE news, it was a wonderful moment to see the excitement on our children's faces as they left and returned from their cross country event – especially as they boarded the coach. The children showed determination and team spirit and returned celebrating their personal and collective success. Well done team in hitting the ratings of the top 10 schools. Our multi- sports clubs are full of buzz and energy, with engagement across each phase. Not only has there been strategy in PE, but also the new Chess Club, with Mrs Hahn and Mr Turner has been well attended with children learning chess piece positions and direction of travel. We have seen children helping each other. Attendance to the 11+ club has doubled in uptake, with children's positive attitudes highly visible.

The history club, shared their very first newspaper with me, 'the Egyptian Times', they included information about building the Pyramids and the Pharaoh Khufu. It even included jokes, including the following: What did the Pharaoh say when he suddenly awoke from a nightmare? I want my mummy!

At the start of October, we begin thinking about some special events. Today marks the start of Black History Month with children engaging in 'deeper days' exploring the contributions of successful people from the past and within living memory. #### **Around the Academy**

This week in **Year 1** we have been reading the story The Paper Dolls. We have enjoyed also using it in our topic, thinking about how people would create their own toys from materials they had. This meant they could still enjoy having a doll, made out of paper to play with. We have been using the story to help us learn in our RHSE lessons, learning about ourselves and our bodies and about the different body parts. We are looking forward to making our own paper dolls!

In **Year 2** this week we have practised identifying the materials that common objects are made from. We have found out that things can be made with more than one material. We have also been exploring the best material to make a party plate from what is recyclable, sturdy and waterproof. We have finished our 2 week writing cycle on the 'Tiger Who Came to Tea' and we have enjoyed changing the food the tiger eats into healthy foods. Well done to all of those children that have moved on to card 15 of their times table test.

In Science this week, **Year 3** have been learning about insulators and conductors. We have been testing a variety of objects to see if they stop the flow of electricity around a circuit. Our conclusion is that all conductors are made of metal and all other materials are insulators. We are looking forward to learning about magnets next week. In writing, we have been retelling the story of Anansi and the Turtle, a traditional tale from Africa, focusing on the use of conjunctions. Our Learning and Life Skills lesson this week has been about active listening and following instructions. The children demonstrated great listening skills when completing a variety of tasks in the classroom.

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Next week we will be celebrating the Harvest Festival. To support a local charity, St. Vincent de Paul Society, we are collecting a variety of food and toiletry donations. Please send them in with your child by Friday 8<sup>th</sup> October.

This week in **Year 4** we have been writing our own stories about a forgotten instrument. All the teachers have been really impressed with the range of fantastic vocabulary used, ask your child to retell you their story! In maths we have been working on addition and subtraction strategies including when you need to regroup. In connected curriculum we have taken part in a science experiment to explore the size of shadows. The children made their own puppets and used torches to explore the effect of the puppet being closer or further away from the light. All of the teachers were delighted to see not only some great scientific exploration but also super teamwork too. Well done year 4.

In **Year 5** this week the children have been learning about subtraction and creating secret formulas in mathematics. Across the curriculum they have been great investigators, looking at repeating patterns within computing and also exploring concepts and ideas in science developing their understanding of the different states of matter. They have considered the types of food we eat, learning the food pyramid and bringing in resources for the children's lunch box project. Thank you for your support. Also we have received amazing donations for our harvest collection this year. Well done to all. Y5 Team

Year 6 have been learning about the Windrush generation and about how certain communities were invited to Britain to work after the war. The children are writing in character this week about their invite and arrival in Britain and then about the reality of actually living and working here next week. In science we have been learning about space suit designs and creating our own with many useful features: visors, control panels, heating systems, robots, recording devices and thermal insulating materials to name a few. We have also learnt about the order of the planets and some interesting facts about each planet. In PSHE we have learnt about respecting differences and different kinds of families. In music we are either learning the ukulele or the glockenspiel. Our head boy and head girl are also busy preparing speeches for our open evening. Thank you to all of the families that have contributed towards our Harvest collection. If you have not donated yet but would like to, please keep the donations coming.



Within our school community, we are very fortunate to have students from diverse backgrounds and therefore strongly support promoting our British Values of tolerance and respect of others and their beliefs.

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
