#### Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

What a brilliant week! The children returned to school looking extremely smart in their uniforms and in great spirits. I have loved seeing everyone back again and welcoming new starters to the Early Years too. They entered the academy grounds with independence, enjoying meeting friends and staff on the playgrounds. Please continue to arrive at the time the gates open, to avoid waiting and to support the 'drop and go' system, maintaining the flow of pedestrian traffic. The KS2 gate opens first at 8:30 – 8:40, providing a ten minute window to walk into the grounds and allowing year 3 – 6 to socialise with their friends. The KS1 gate opens at 8:35, with staff ready to meet and greet their classes on the Ks1 playground. Our youngest children are met at the brook gate at 8:40, when all children are walked to class for a prompt start to their morning routines and learning. All teachers and leaders have been very impressed with the speed and independence, during morning registration. Well done to all our children!

Children and staff have been happily catching up with each other, sharing news of their summer experiences. We have also enjoyed some visits from our recent year six leavers, who have returned to share their first day experiences of secondary school. They looked very smart in their uniforms too. It is always a joy to see them and hear how they are getting on. Our new year six are excited to be at the top of the school and have been happily telling me all about their first few days. In particular, they have been sharing how proud they are to wear a shirt and tie. They look very smart and have positive attitudes toward the year ahead.

This week, children and staff, have been settling back into academy life, establishing routines and building relationships. This half term, we are focused on the learning and life skill, 'Learning Together' and during this week children have engaged in some great team challenges. We value the importance of collaboration and team work and are looking forward to our 'Shaping the Future' event, later this month, when our children will engage in a range of house team activities within their phases at the end of the month.
