We have discussed and learnt about positional language, road safety and the features that we may see in the environment such as a bridge, a post box or even a zebra crossing. Around the Academy

In **Year 1**, we have been getting excited and ready for our upcoming Winter celebrations with our first rehearsals of the nativity in the hall! We are all proud of ourselves for learning our lines and songs so well and can't wait to perform for our families. We have also been looking at the different oceans around the world and created our very own maps making sure that we knew where all the continents and oceans are! Finally, we have been Little Red Riding Hood in our writing lessons and enjoying thinking about different adjectives to use for the wolf in the story!

This week in **Year 2**, we have added detail to our Tudor houses by attaching wooden beams and window frames. We have talked about the materials that we use and how this contributed to the fire. We have spent some time learning about what architects do and have designed a bird's eye view of our classrooms. We have also started to practice for our Christmas performance and the children are very enthusiastic about it. The song lyrics will be put on to DB Primary early next week and we would really appreciate it if you could support your child in learning the words.

This week, **Year 3** have been focusing on the ancient civilisation of Egypt and the Egyptians. We have studied the structure of their homes, how they were built and the importance of the River Nile to these people. The children have been fascinated by all the interesting facts they have learnt!!

In **Year 4** this week we have been learning about the Anglo Saxons and what life was like in Britain after they invaded. Continuing with our writing along the same theme, the children have written their own versions of Beowulf and created their own monsters that were defeated by a heroic warrior. The descriptive language they have used has been incredible! With maths this week we have all been looking at patterns in the times tables to embed their knowledge of them even further. Thank you for supporting us with TT Rockstars this week. Engagement has increased but we are still not seeing all children logging on regularly. Please keep going with this as the children love getting their rewards and certificates for improving correct answers and speed increases. We are now in the full throws of Christmas singing and decorations and the children have a lovely happy buzz about them at the moment. We hope you all have a lovely weekend.

This week **Year 5** have been carefully looking at perimeter and area in maths which can be very useful when allocating different dinosaurs different style enclosures based upon their size or else there could be some escapees!

Continuing with our World War One diaries but this time we have made it to the front line and describing some of the horrendous conditions suffered by the soldiers. Learning about the Class system pre WW1 and the impact that the war had upon it.

We have been exploring the Jewish festival of Hanukkah in RE and the significance of different customs and traditions.

We have started rehearsing for out Christmas concert which is coming up pretty quick!



This week, **Year 6** have been thinking about what life was like for Victorian women and making comparisons to the lives of women of today. We have thought carefully about the women's suffrage movement by studying primary and secondary historical sources and thought about how we would have acted if we were faced with the same choices. For homework, children have been researching The Romans and we look forward to their presentations. If it is not possible to create a digital presentation then children can use A3 paper, which their teacher will supply.

Oliver Collins in year 6 Strand class achieved his black belt in karate at the weekend after 5 years training with Westwood Karate Academy.






