Projects and developments

This year at Darlinghurst Academy we have undertaken some summer projects in response to our pupil voice.

Quiet spaces:

This has included adding quiet spaces for relaxation and mindfulness around the academy, supporting the well-being areas for children and staff. We have a combination of indoor and outdoor spaces, such as our beach huts, including the Mindfulness Hut, mindful corners

Over the year, we continue to develop the outside of the library with murals of our English Garden – A garden and a library is the perfect place to read and grow. Reading:

Continuing with the theme of promoting a love of reading, I know that children and staff enjoyed the reading challenge, enjoying reading at home and away, sharing photographs of their settings. Some looked picturesque and others looked exciting – Mrs Hahn enjoyed a book on a Safari and looked like she could read the lion the story, she was so close! Well done to all the children who completed the Library Reading challenge, 'Gadgeteers', receiving certificates and medals for your participation. We are keen to continue to share a love of reading over this year, with daily reading within the academy and home, school library and local library visits, special reading events, book swaps and more. We are hoping to create a reading trail around the academy grounds too. If you have any quality books to donate to our special reading spaces or future book swaps, we would be delighted to receive these. The reading team, will be promoting these, keep a look out for messages about, 'reading' at school and at home.

Break and lunch times:



Last year, children and staff reviewed break time and lunchtime provision and in response activity zones were created utilising spaces and resources, alongside learning playtime games. Children used the equipment within the zones as well as playing in nature. The Play Squad and Peer Mentors were trained and supported break-times well and new appointments will be made this half term for these active roles. The children have a variety of choice with main meals, vegetarian, pasta, jacket potatoes and pick and mix. We recognise the importance of a healthy lunch, in



school and hope that our children give our school meals a try. We also promote healthy lunch boxes and politely remind parents that we are a nut free school and fizzy drinks are not allowed. We encourage healthy snacks. Our year six children were delighted to discover that the end hall is now dedicated to year 6 dining, with their own dining experience – inclusive of table cloths and their own serving area, offering fruit, salad, bread and water. The dining hall prefects support lunchtimes too.







Pick up and drop off

Thank you for a great start to the term and adapting so quickly to pick up and drop off. It is lovely to be able to be on the playground. Please be aware that we have opened gates 5 minutes ahead of the start and end of day to provide a window for entry. Children can arrive within this window. At home time, children will not be led to the playground until 3:10, therefore please do not arrive too early as we have made these changes to reduce congestion outside the academy and to be able to be together in a larger space. For those parents who travel to school by car, please be considerate of our neighbours and each other, following the rules of the road. I understand that we are amongst a residential area and you may need to park, with a short walk into the school area.





A positive return and welcome to new starters



Learning and Life Skills

Next week, we are launching our Learning and Life skills – learning together. Mrs Cooke will be sharing some information in next week's N& V, including ways to develop this skill at home. They will also be a feature in children's homework.

DB Primary and homework

Children's homework will be accessed via DB Primary. All children have a DB Primary account and this platform provides a secure and moderated online environment. Each class has their own community area to access home learning tasks, activities, blogs and more. This year, within DB Primary, we are providing a half termly overview of the homework, breaking down elements to focus on each week. Teachers will also add blogs or information, as needed. This platforms allows for safe communication on line. Home learning tasks continue to support children developing their key skills in reading (phonics or Accelerated Reader), number bonds or Times tables (Times Table Rockstars), Spellings (SIrLinkALot) and using Knowledge organisers to learn key facts.

Logins

Children have logins for their TTRS accounts giving access to the APP or website. They will be bringing home their DB Primary logins next week. Other communication platforms

Communication and relationships are important to us. We continue to share rationales with parents to keep you well informed on what we are doing and why. We plan to keep you well informed and review our approaches in response to feedback. We continue to use School Ping as our communication tool, sharing messages with you. We ask any new parents to download the app.



Our internal systems have now provide us access to, 'My child At School' a great APP that provides a simple dashboard of your child's class, attendance and clubs. This will be used for

Club selection and will display the clubs your child attends for your reference. Clubs will commence, 19th September to allow for this new system to be launched and time for parents to enrol. Attendance and Punctuality

The academy target this year is for every child to achieve 97% attendance. For children to gain the greatest benefit from their education it is vital they attend regularly and are at school on time, every day the academy is open.

Good attendance is a learned behaviour and every parent/carer has the legal responsibility to ensure that their child is receiving an education.

There is no entitlement in law for pupils to take time off during the term to go on holiday. Requests for leave forms must be completed with an accompanying letter and handed in with ample time for the academy to review. Failure to follow the academy process in full will result in the absence being unauthorised.

Regular absence may trigger further intervention in line with our attendance policy. To report an absence please contact 01702 509205 before 09:30am, if you are unable to speak to a member of staff please leave a message with details of the reason your child is absent.

Gates open at 08:30am and close at 08:40am, after which children are late and must meet Miss Davis outside the front of the office irrespective of the weather. We continue to request that no mobile phones are used whilst on the school grounds. Signs are displayed on the gates to remind you of this.
