## EYFS in the Spotlight

Wow! This half-term has flown-by and what an exciting time it has been in Nursery and Reception. We have further developed our knowledge about bears and the countries that they tend to originate from such as polar bears in the Arctic and panda bears in China. Studying a map the children were keen to spot where we live and label it, then labelled where the bears live too. Nursery worked together plotting their information on the huge wall map. In Reception the children are filling in their own map which we will add other information to throughout the year.



We thoroughly enjoyed celebrating Chinese New Year, which led to many colourful and creative opportunities. Our classrooms were awash with dragons, red envelopes, lanterns and fans and the children enjoyed practicing their own Chinese dragon dancing. We shared the story of 'The Great Race', which explains the order of the animals in the Chinese calendar. We are now in the year of the 'Rabbit'. What year were you born in?



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This week, the focus has been predominantly on exploring how we can all be more environmentally friendly. We have shared stories such as 'Michael Recycle' and 'The Litter Bug', which led to many conversations about rubbish. What is rubbish? Now that was an interesting debate! As the week progressed the children discovered that so many goods can be re-used rather than be disposed of.



Nursery immersed themselves into creating many different new items using goods that would otherwise have been put in the bin. Food packing was turned into objects such as a 'STOP' sign for our Rockpool garden zebra crossing. It was a joy to hear the new musical instruments being played in the garden too; all made using unwanted food packaging. The children learnt that 'chick peas makes a hard sound and the sand makes a soft sound.' Well done, Nursery! You are certainly



being super eco-friendly.

During the week the children had tremendous fun making their own paper in the Rockpool garden. First, they collected scrap paper from around the school and shredded it into smaller pieces. Then they filled a tube full of the tiny pieces of paper. Next they added water and learned that the water reacts with the paper and slowly breaks it down. To speed up the process a variety of tools were used to mix and churn the water and paper up. Using whisks, spoons, mashers, graters and their hands the children pretended to be like a huge washing machine


churning the mixture into 'pulp'. Then they sieved the pulp to remove some excess water and then took the slushy mush and squeezed it between our hands and placed on areaseproof paper. To remove even more excess water we placed a towel over it and stepped on it until the towel was wet. We then placed the paper in the sun to dry. The end result is amazing! We are rather proud of our new paper and look forward to writing on it after the holiday. Perhaps you could have a go at making your own paper too? Have fun!

Although the weather has been cold, January for outdoor learning has been very busy and the children have really enjoyed being outside. The whole school have been part of the RSPB Birdwatch 2023 and we have finished recording our results and will be sending them off shortly.





Our children in Reception have learnt about different types of ways animals can camouflage and how they use the environment to do this. In year 3 they have been creative making Mayan Temples in the wellbeing garden and year 6 have been busy





making bird feeders and investigating invertebrates and vertebrates connecting with their Evolution topic.
