Message from the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to the final half of the Summer Term and what a bright and sunny start it has been. The weather has been glorious and the children have returned ready to learn. Due to the heat, we are reminding our children about sun safety and hydration throughout the day. For this term, children can wear the summer uniform, in order to keep a little cooler too.

This half term is always a busy half term, focused on not only completing this academic year but preparing ahead. Regular attendance to the academy is important, as during this time we continue to support our children's developments, preparing them for their next steps. This information will be shared in their end of year reports to parents. During this half term, we will also be sharing dates and transition information and other summer events. Any absence requests must follow the academy policy and be submitted with ample time for review. This week we revived our attendance celebrations, with classes receiving attendance certificates to classes for the highest attendance.

This week, was the start of 'Multicultural fortnight', with cross curricular learning across the academy in a range of subject areas. Children have been celebrating their heritage and learning about other cultures within our community and beyond. I have loved seeing the children engage and share their experiences, celebrating cultural diversity. I would like to thank parents too for their engagement and support. We continue with this theme, next week too.

At this time of year, we start to plan ahead for our Shaping the Future event - a time where children and staff focus on the vision and values of the academy and engage in activities within their houses. In preparation, I would love families to engage in a creative project, a pebble art project over the summer holidays so that we can create a shoal of fish for our special event and an outdoor art project.

This year we are using the story book, 'Only One you' by Lind Kranz. It is a book that encourages selfconfidence & self-belief in children. The perfect choice. Not only does the captivating artwork inspire, but the short meaningful texts offer reassurance as well as useful advice.

Around the Academy

Year 1 have really enjoyed learning about each other's special days out that we had in half term or previously and linking them to our new topic, 'Where would we go for a special day out?'. We have loved using the story 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' by John Burningham for ideas to write our own short stories about what could happen during an outing on a river with animal friends as passengers! We have continued having fun with the sunny weather at lunchtime by sharing different PE equipment, construction toys and story books with our friends in the playground to strengthen our friendships. We hope the sun will last!

Year 2 have launched their new Edison topic "How did families have fun in the past". We have enjoyed exploring the kinds of games that would have been played before the technology that we all enjoy today was invented. The children have played jacks, pick up stick, noughts and crosses and dominoes. We are looking forward to finding out more about entertainment in the past particularly at the seaside. Our new learning and life skill is Speaking and Listening. We have been developing our active listening skills this week by sharing our own ideas and giving our own opinion when discussing the ways in which we like to have fun.

This week in **Year 3**, we began our Multicultural Fortnight by celebrating the African country of Nigeria. The children have been finding out lots of facts about this amazing country and are looking forward to finding out more in our forthcoming lessons. Later this week, they will be playing Nigerian games and creating art and craft activities next week too.

It's been a great start back to the half term for **Year 4**. We have been enjoying writing a story based on the Hans Christian Anderson story 'The Snow Queen'. We have also been exploring where all the continents of the world are situated and where to find them on a world map. As part of our multicultural fortnight we have been exploring the country of Malta and encourage any children who wish to, to prepare a short presentation on their country to share with the class. Some of our year group starting their swimming lessons this week which has been very exciting, the rest of the year can't wait to go next week! We've all been enjoying the warm weather at break and lunch and if parents/carers could ensure their children have a water bottle with them every day.



What a great start back to school. Not only is the sun shining but **Year 5** are too! As part of multicultural focus week, children have started to learn about another country and its cultures. We have chosen to take a closer look at Bangladesh, and as true geographers examined its location within the world, its physical features and how this compares with those of Great Britain. Lots more interesting facts and activities to follow! In writing we have continued this theme through writing stories based on Moana - the brave young teenager who longs to explore her Polynesian island. The children focused on using prepositions and descriptive vocabulary to enhance their story. We have also made links to locations in our maths lessons, exploring coordinates and translating them.

Lastly, don't forget those hats and water bottles for next week!

It has been lovely to welcome the **Year 6** children back after the half-term break especially with the warmer weather finally arriving. The children have enjoyed catching up with their friends and teachers ready for their final few weeks at Darlinghurst. They have been writing letters of complaint and practising using a firm but polite tone to inform a restaurant of something strange being found in their food – we've had things ranging from mice in hot chocolate to acrylic nails in chips...well done for your creativity Year 6! We have started learning about India as part of Multi-cultural fortnight and have practised our atlas and map skills by locating Commonwealth countries and main cities, rivers and mountains in India itself. We are looking forward to finding out more about this amazing country-we were amazed at how big it is in comparison to the UK! Keep up your hard work and enthusiasm Year 6!

Upper KS2 - Wilton who recycled 407 pieces of paper!




Well done to every class for recycling and keeping our classrooms clean every day.
