All of the children and staff are very excited and looking forward to their Pirate party on Wednesday. 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Around the Academy

With transition in mind the **year 1** children have been enjoying the story of Cody, a cautious caterpillar, who was unsure if she wanted to change into a butterfly. Her insect friends reassured her she would like being able to fly, sip nectar and have only six legs. When she felt brave and her body changed Cody did feel good about the changes and happy flying around as a butterfly with her friends. We have linked this story with our own thoughts about change at the end of a school year and the children have been really mature when discussing their thoughts. We have also been learning about capacity in maths, enjoying the practical activities of pouring cold water into different size containers to check our predictions about how many units of water different shape packaging can hold.

Year 2 have been enjoying making their own puzzles and cup and ball games as we have been learning about how people used to have fun in the past. They have been creating some fantastic designs thinking about the things that are important when making an effective puzzle. In maths, we have been learning about money and using money to solve real-life problems. In writing, we have been describing the likes and dislikes of a person we know and next week we will be writing about our own likes and dislikes.

Year 3 have been enjoying writing about and describing Old Leigh using lots of interesting adjectives and phrases to describe the smells, sights and sounds. In Geography, we have been learning about Nigeria and comparing life there to here in the UK. There are some similarities and differences which we've found very interesting. In Maths, we have been investigating and comparing numbers to 1000.

In **year 4** this week, we had a hot but enjoyable trip to Chalkwell Park were the children took part in orienteering and impressed us with their understanding of co-ordinates and map reading. We have been organising a holiday to Copenhagen, in maths, deciding how we would like to spend our £3800 budget. The children had to decide between budget or first class flights and then work out how much they could then spend on the hotel, sightseeing and spending money. Unsurprisingly, many chose WI-FI as an optional extra in the hotel.

Year 4 trip reflection by Mila, Emme and Grace

On Monday morning Dune, Coral and Seashell went to Chalkwell Park to do some geocaching and orienteering as well as some learning and life skills activities. When we got there Mrs Arnold explained what we were going to be doing. We all got into groups. We had to search for flags around the park using our maps and coordinates. Each flag had a challenge for us to complete on it including anagrams and building a home for an ant! In total there were 5 flags. After that, we had our lunch in the shade and Mrs Alexander's parents dropped us all off an ice lolly as a surprise. We played some games including parachutes and did some learning and life skills activities too. It was a hot but enjoyable day.

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Art special


This half term the children have been working with an Artist from Metal in some of their Art and Outdoor learning sessions. The title of the project is Art Makes Children Powerful and is a national Art Initiative aimed at enrichment, aspirations for the future, well being and the attainment of new skills. Philippa Stewart is a local sculptor with a textiles background as well as having vast




knowledge of historical skills, such as weaving and spinning using natural and recyclable materials, which fits beautifully with our school Eco ethos.



The children learnt how to wattle and daub, and thatch on a natural sculpture based on an Iron Age dwelling. We made Machetes (models) in the pre design process to learn how the natural sculpture starts its life. We made fossils of leaves after leaf rubbing, based on Fish trap fossils as we learnt about our ancestor's methods for hunting and gathering. The results are to be placed on our sculptures, as





own printing blocks from used card and foam.

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

Household Support Fund – Summer holiday allocation 2022

The Government has provided Southend Borough Council with additional grant money and therefore Southend City Council is continuing with the FSM voucher scheme over the Summer holiday period 2022. Southend City Council is awarding a single payment of £45.00 for each child eligible for Free School Meals. **This payment is a 'one off' payment to cover the whole of the summer holiday period.** The vouchers will be issued by the school via WONDE, the same method that has been used previously, by 20th July 2022. This is the final round of the Renewed Household Support Fund, unless the Government allocates any further funding. If this is the case you will be informed by the school.
