senses to challenges. This included, blindfold challenge, back to back drawing, musical composition with instruments nature sounds and building habitats in the woods for our woodland friends.




We also have been enjoying the new menus with our catering team, Aspen's. The Junior Governors have been gathering feedback and shared this with the Cook and are looking
