Communication is important and we want to ensure that parents and children are able to receive information easily and in good time. It is important that parents feel they receive valuable communication and feedback is always reviewed and considered. I know that parents would like to have key dates with as much notice as possible and we will be sharing event calendars and our uniform shop dates with you shortly.



We have used school Ping for a few years. This is our main source of communication with messages and letters sent via this system. This includes the sharing of our weekly News and Views. Please do keep an eye on your pina messages throughout the year for important

Many parents have activated the 'My Child at School' app and used this to select clubs for the half term. This app will be used for our other booking systems, such as parent consultation. Our club uptake is always positive with high club attendance.



All of our internal clubs are free, providing access for all. It is wonderful that so many children engage with our extra-curricular offer and I would like to thank the staff for their additional time and for endeavouring to provide space or adding capacity for those on waiting lists. Staff have confirmed that should waiting lists occur in the future they will look at those interested and offer spaces for the following term to avoid disappointment.



DB Primary has been used as part of past homework and for sharing our blended learning packages. Most of our children are familiar with this software, including the e-safety modules. Staff will be sharing homework on DB Primary this week. DB primary can be accessed from our home page on the website. This includes a copy of the half termly overview, which is also accessible via a tab on their class homepage.





Numbots is being shared with year one and is an app for younger children ahead of TTRS. Children will also bring home a phonics or AR reading book to read each day with sharing books to promote a love of reading. Additional information on DB, AR, TTRS and Numbots is being shared with parents via Ping.







Tapestry is used as a communication platform and learning journey for our Early Years. Parents engage with the Journal and receive updates from the staff. We have used Tapestry for a number of years and allows parents and staff to work in partnership.

Learning and Life Skills

Our first Learning and Life Skill of the year is 'Learning Together'. The focus skills for this half term are:

- Learning a part of a group

The purpose of this unit is to help the children to build their skills of learning with other people.
