Guitar Lessons

Lessons cost £10 for a 20 minute one-to-one lesson and there will be a total of 10 lessons per term (so a total cost of £100 per term). The lessons will take place within school and during the school day. To secure guitar lessons for your child, please logon to your ParentPay account and pay a deposit of £20. The balance of £80 will then be payable in January. (PLEASE NOTE if your child already had guitar lessons this term then we have automatically saved their slot for next term, this deposit is for new guitar players only).

Attendance

This term we've continued to focus on attendance, ensuring that attendance remains in line with expectations. We remind parent/carers to call the Academy on the first day of absence where you can speak to a member of staff or leave a voicemail. You may be asked to provide medical evidence for any illness that results in more than 2 days absence to ensure that any underlying health needs are identified and that the Academy can offer appropriate support.

Punctuality

Punctuality is important at both the start and end of the day. Lateness is monitored and persistent lateness with result in escalation. The start of the academy day is a sharp start with gates closing at 08:40, arrivals after this time are late and the number of minutes late is monitored. Persistent lateness may result in further intervention. Please contact the main office and speak with Miss Davis if you have any morning difficulties you would like discuss or require support with.
