

Children in UPKS2 went to a London Theatre with past (now grown up) pupils of Darlinghurst.

I am incredibly passionate about theatre and the arts and its power to spark imagination and the passion to chase our dreams however wild they may be. As a child I would write plays for my fellow friends at Darlinghurst Academy, perform on the stage in the school's main hall and after seeing Oliver in the West End I joined the schools brass band as I was so amazed looking into the orchestra pit. My brother Steven, also an ex Darlinghurst pupil, would write stories and plays and send them to publishers and wouldn't ever give up. He is now a stage and television writer and founded the Caedmon Company in 2020.
