Around the Academy

This week in **Year 1**, we have enjoyed welcoming the children back and starting our new topic 'Why is water precious?' The children have discussed and explored the topic asking lots of questions, sharing their ideas as a class and are looking forward to completing the topic this half term. We have looked and read the story 'And Tango Makes Three' where we have discussed the story together and the children have enjoyed creating their own version of this story. During maths, we have looked at numbers within 20. The children have discovered and explored number lines to work out the difference between two numbers. We have had a great week and enjoyed our learning very much!

This week in writing, **Year 2** have learnt how to look after a cat and have been very thoughtful in the ways they would care for it. Also, they have become scientists and chosen an animal to research. We have discovered what our animal eats, its habitat and interesting facts about it. We have learnt so much! For example, sharks cannot feel pain and don't have any bones! We will be using this learning to support our 'how to look after a...' writing next week. Our new term's learning and life skill is 'Knowing Me, Knowing You' and Year 2 have been demonstrating this beautifully by showing consideration and being very thoughtful towards their peers. In maths, we have been taking on the challenge of learning column subtraction with 2-digit numbers.

In **Year 3** this week we have started our topic 'Are bugs important?' so we are going to experience being mini scientists this term. We can't wait. In writing we are imagining we have shrunk down to tiny ants and exploring the world from this perspective. We have used 'A Bugs Life' as a stimulus. As part of this we have been discussing life processes of living things and what makes us an animal. We are looking forward to learning more about the world around us.


This week in **Year 4** we have really enjoyed receiving the children's 'Variety Week' homework, what a creative bunch! We introduced our new topic, for this term, 'What happens inside our bodies?' The children had great fun recording their resting heart rate and their heart rate following 1 minute of exercise and were amazed to learn why the beats per minute had increased. In maths we are learning about decimals and have discussed how we use them in everyday life. Maybe the children can wow you with their subtraction or addition skills when out shopping! This week we have been writing, to entertain our readers, about a very lazy and unhealthy pirate focussing on the use of inverted commas. Keep on rocking with TTRS and have a lovely weekend.

It has been a great start to the new term despite the windy weather! **Year 5** Pupils are ready to get to know each other better and themselves, through our 'Knowing Me, Knowing You' life skill target, striving to be the best they can be. In writing, we are focussing on using dialogue to understand more about characters and move the story along. In maths, pupils have been excited to use protractors to measure angles and make connections with real life situations. For computing lessons, the children have been introduced to 'Scratch' and are very much looking forward to finding out more about coding. In our RE lessons, pupils have started to explore a variety of special days, considering different traditions and customs and making links with their own celebrations. Our music lessons have been a real challenge trying to find the pulse and rhythm and rap along with Will Smith! The contributions for Variety week have been fabulous highlighting the rich diversity within our classes.



Year 6 have started a new topic called 'Let's go around again.' This is science based which will revise electricity and the human body in preparation for Year 7. This will culminate in a Science Fair at the end of term, where in small groups, the children will present their own scientific experiment to the rest of the year group. We have asked Year 6 to get their thinking caps on! In our writing lessons, we are writing a piece titled 'The Dive', where we are writing a sports commentary on Tom Daley's Olympic dive. In maths, we have been learning about averages: mean, median and mode. Thank you for all of the wonderful collages, videos, poems and photographs celebrating our Diversity week focus, 'Express yourself'. Please continue to encourage your child to complete Accelerated Reader quizzes once they have read their books.
