Message from the Principal

This week, we have focused on our Academy value of Confidence. In assemblies we have discussed how confidence and self-esteem is important to help us develop into self-assured individuals and looked at a range of tools we can use to build both of these skills. In addition, we looked at how 'trying new things out for the first time' and 'having a go' at something new are important skills to develop, these skills help us overcome challenges and providing us with the determination to push forward when we find things hard.



Over the past week, I myself had to dig deep to find the confidence to try something new. I had to develop new learning as I took my moped test, having never ridden a moped before. This was new learning and a steep learning curve. I found the 6 hour long examination process very challenging but drew upon my core values of determination and confidence which led to me being successful and passing my exam. As a result of this experience I was able to talk to the children about how when you face challenges and make mistakes (I made a few) you have to fight negative thoughts and believe you can – and you will. This week, Nursery and Reception have thoroughly enjoyed continuing our learning about dinosaurs. We shared the story 'The Girl and The Dinosaur' which led us to investigate and learn about fossils. We dug up an area in our fairy garden so that we could plant seeds. We were hoping to find some dinosaurs bones, like in the story, but not on this occasion! The children are so excited about the recent planting we have done in the garden and it has been a joy to see them using our 'Potting Shed'. Around the Academy

This week in year 1, we have become scientists and looked at water and where it comes from. The children have had discussions about water sources, the environment and where we can get water from in school and at home. All the children enjoyed creating their own map of the school and labelled the water sources in our school environment. During maths, we have looked at length where the children were able to measure a variety of objects. They all used rulers and their hands and feet to measure and collect date for how long or tall different items were in the classroom. In writing, we have created a set of instructions for how we get ready for school. The children have shared their ideas and enjoyed talking about how they all get ready for school differently. We have had a great week of learning!

Year 2 have had a wonderful time making their very own clay animals this week. They needed to draw their chosen animal in its natural habitat and then were taught how to extrude clay in order to form the body, head and arms and smooth it all out to make their animal look as realistic as possible. We also started to paint our animals in realistic colours and have used our outdoor learning spaces to make them shelters. In maths we have enjoyed revisiting previous learning on 2-D shape and applying this to 3-D shape where we have been able to identify the faces on them. We have also had a go at some origami which is the Japanese art of paper folding and then we have written instructions on how to make an origami dog.

In year 3 this week we having writing about whether homework should be banned and discussing the arguments for and against. Many of the children have concluded that homework really helps them build their confidence in the classroom and is good preparation for senior school. On the other hand, children have considered how it might impact on their time to play their favourite games. It's been a very interesting debate. We have also been learning about food chains and who eats what in Science, they were glad to know humans were top of the food chain. The children are also very excited to start to design their bug hotel to make next week and use all the lovely resources they have been bringing into school. We hope everyone is enjoying the lovely weather this week and long may in continue.

In year 4 we have been learning why pirates died from scurvy and that James Lind, who discovered the cure, was also the founder of the 'fair test'. We used this knowledge to write a diary pretending to be a pirate who is suffering with the dreaded scurvy. In maths, we have enjoyed investigating the area of shapes and learning why they are not always drawn to scale. In Religious Education, we have enjoyed learning all about The Easter Story and how Christians remember and celebrate the significant events. In Learning and Life Skills, the children have investigated different scenarios and discussed how they would react with a positive mind set. It was fantastic to listen to their solutions. Keep rocking with TTRS you are doing an amazing job year 4. We are so proud!

This week year 5 have been applying what they have learnt about percentages to real life scenarios. They have been able to solve problems with multiple steps to work out a total after it has been reduced or increased. Bembridge class really enjoyed the science workshop led by Westcliff High School sixth form students, which immersed the children in a variety of activities based around physics, chemistry and biology. In computing, the children are becoming confident in coding algorithms to create their own auizzes. In the lead up to Ramadan, Year 5 have been exploring the meaning behind the holy month and what takes place during it. This has been the inspiration behind our writing this week as the children have written narratives about the day in the life of a child called Zakki who is fasting for the first time.

Year 6 would like to thank everyone for their contributions to the KS2 and KS1 cake sales. We had some fantastic bakes, which were sold in a flash! We really appreciate all of your support. Currently, we are busy preparing for SATs, with a real focus on grithmetic. All the children are working really hard and the year 6 team is very proud of them. Children are also preparing for the year 6 science fair, which will take place next week, where they will present a small science project to the rest of the year group.
