On Wednesday, we waved goodbye (for an hour) to some of our children who were visiting their new Reception classes, and although it was a reminder to us, that they will be leaving soon, we are also super excited to be able to be a part of their new adventures in Reception. We have been busy making plans and looking at our shared outside space, to make it the most exciting extension of our classrooms in September. Please don't forget that Monday is Pirate dress up day, we've got our costumes ready, we hope you all have too. Ooh arr me harties!!!

The great ship Nursery

This week in **Jellyfish and Starfish** we have continued our 'Under the Sea' topic by sharing poems from the book 'Commotion in the Ocean'.

Searching for the rhyming words has been fun and we realised that not all poems have to rhyme. In maths the children have shown us their knowledge from last week's homework about floating and sinking. We have also used shells and pebbles to explore weight using the balance scales. Each day the teachers have modelled a sentence based on one of the sea creatures in the book and then the children have written their own sentence too. To make it exciting the children have been able to choose a sea creature sticker to put in their writing book. Then they wrote their own sentences about it, using their phonic knowledge, resources and displays in the environment to help them. The teachers are super-duper impressed with how neat the children's writing is becoming. Well done, Reception!

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Don't forget that The Rockpool are to come to school on Monday 28th June dressed as a pirate. What adventures we will have!!!!

Please ensure that your child has a named water bottle in school every day, which is separate to a packed lunch drink. Around the Academy

In **Year 1** we have continued to be geographers thinking about the difference between man-made and natural features with the story 'Katie in London'. We really loved writing our own stories about Katie's exciting time visiting world famous landmarks on the back of a lion, who she met in Trafalgar Square! In maths we have continued to think of numbers that bond together to make 20 and have investigated capacity using a variety of different containers. In our learning of different world faiths, we have enjoyed holding and discussing everyday items important to the Jewish community.

This week in **Year 2** we have been exploring coastal erosion, the children have found out how powerful nature is and we conducted an experiment to show what happens when a lot of water is introduced to a cliff made of rocks and soil. We have also been finding out about the important work that the RNLI does and learning about water safety. We have linked this to our story writing this week where Mr Grinling the lighthouse keeper gets blown off of a cliff by his kite and needs to be rescued (luckily he is very good at floating!)

In **Year 3**, we have started exploring our new topic after very much enjoying 'Multi-Cultural Fortnight' with our focus on Nigeria. Our final topic of year 3, 'How can we make living here better?' is all about our local environment and what we can do to help protect and save our surroundings from climate change and other potential harm. We have begun investigating this further in our writing lessons this week where we have been planning a leaflet about 'How to Save our Planet'. In our afternoon lessons we have also looked at ways of improving our local area and created posters to share and promote our message. In maths, we have continued with our fraction work, looking at mixed fractions and fractions and decimals this week. We have also learnt 'What is your name?' and 'My name is_____' in Spanish which the children thoroughly enjoyed and are very confident with.

Another busy week for the **Year 4** children. This week in writing we have been continuing the adventures of 'Kai and the Snow Queen' as they travel across distant lands to the Snow Queen's home. We have been really impressed with the fantastic vocabulary used – well done everyone! Mr Felton has been proud of how well the children have been progressing in their swimming lessons and behaving so well on the journey there and back too. In RE the children have been exploring Hinduism and in particular the custom of 'Puja'. Swordfish class certainly enjoy the incense sticks and the wonderful smell it created in their classroom. Participation in TTRS remains high with Stingray class enjoying battling Mrs Cooke on Monday with great success! Keep up the good work year 4.

This week in **Year 5**, the children were introduced to their new geography topic 'where do I live?' where they were asked to think about which geographical features affect the way we live. From this, they were able to plot key symbols on an ordinate map of Leigh-on-sea. In writing, the children put their reporter hats on and wrote a newspaper article about the mysterious happenings of the Bermuda Triangle. They have focused on including cohesive devices to make sure their sentences flow throughout each paragraph. The children really enjoyed learning Bob Marley's 3 Little Birds in music this week. They created actions in place of singing the lyrics to the song and discussed the tempo, pulse and rhythm. Make sure you keep playing Rockstars for 10 minutes every night and keep taking accelerated reader tests on any completed books!



This week, **Year 6** have thought about the message of Martin Luther King and his dream of a world without prejudice. We have written our own updated 'I have a dream' speeches, which are relevant to today's world including what we think needs to change to enable Martin Luther King's dream to become a reality. As usual, the children have impressed us with their maturity and positivity as they have delivered their visions of the future. We have had great fun on our two days enjoying a variety of activities such as circus skills, cooking, animal handling and much more. It was wonderful to see the children engaging with such fantastic opportunities. We are currently planning the final Leavers' assembly and the children are all auditioning for parts and practising their lines. It would be very helpful if you could help your child to learn their song words at home.
