Message from the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

As you will be aware, Southend has moved from National lockdown restrictions to the new Tier 2 restrictions, as of Wednesday. I would like to thank you all again for the support you have provided during the past month. Whilst national restrictions have eased a little, we will continue to maintain our protective measures for the coming weeks to protect our children, staff and families with hope of a happy and safe Christmas.

Our health and safety procedures will continue into the New Year, ensuring a safe return and keeping abreast with guidance. During the Autumn Term, the staff team have shown dedication in ensuring that the current situation has had little impact on our childrens' education, as well as providing them with the support to develop their emotional resilience and well-being. The curriculum has been adapted to meet the needs of our children and to deliver the best education opportunities whilst managing risks or constraints, in line with guidance. The children have engaged in a broad and balanced curriculum, demonstrating achievements and personal success across the curriculum.

Many of our year six children have been celebrating their academic achievements, sharing their results from their 11 plus examination. Every child who sat the exam showed determination and courage, gaining from the experience – each with their own personal success. It was a pleasure to witness some of them hearing or sharing their news – with beaming smiles and jumps for joy!

Our year two staff and leaders have been working with children to increase their competency in decoding words using a range of strategies, e.g. blending lengthy nonsense words, spotting special friends and covering half the

word and blending each section at a time. They have shown resilience and continued determination to their learning, displaying increased confidence and this was evident during their phonic screening check.

The Phonics Screening Check is a compulsory assessment that all children must take. It is used to assess a pupils phonic decoding skills. To pass a student must correctly read around 32/40 words correctly.

The 40 words in the check are split into sections progressing from simple word structures to trickier words with five or six letters. The often confusing thing about the screening check is that 20/40 of the words that children are expected to read are 'nonsense words', alien words that have no meaning. This really tests a child's phonic decoding skills to check they have the appropriate standard.

It is a 'one to one' check with each child. The words are the same all across the country. Each child is scored against the national average. Our year two teachers will discuss phonics and the screening check during parent consultations in January. Further information regarding K\$1 & 2 consultations will be shared after the festive break. Letters have been sent to Nursery and Reception parents outlining our virtual conferencing system, dates and times, this term. Please check your school ping for correspondence. In **Year 1**, we have been learning all about Christingles. We have created our very own Christingle for our Christmas performance at the end of the week and enjoyed learning about why each part is so special. We have been practicing the sign language for Silent Night, a song we discovered was over 200 years old! We are all so excited to share our virtual Christmas with you on DBPrimary.

This week, **Year 2** have adapted the story of The Gingerbread Man. In our new, creative stories our gingerbread men are dressed in something waterproof allowing them to escape across the river at the end of the story. Some gingerbread men still do not survive! We have also been busy designing and making our own party hats for our end of term party. As party planners, we have considered a design criterion for our party hats. We focused on making them bright, colourful and most importantly eye catching!

In **Year 4** this week we have been working hard taking our assessments. However, we remembered that we should work hard and play hard so we have had lots of fun too. In science we investigated how sound is made, we were wowed by the seeds bouncing off a drum as the sound got louder and the sound wave increased in size. Then in groups we created a play, for children, explaining how sound is made. We used lots of scientific vocabulary. In writing we have imagined what it is like to be a blind girl and how she would describe the forest by using her other senses. 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Year 6 have really enjoyed writing their stories where they are trapped somewhere, whether it be in a cell, on a boat or even in the museum. We have been really impressed by the high quality of their writing and their use of vocabulary to create atmosphere and tension. In Maths this week, the children really enjoyed playing a countdown style game to help them understand the order of operations in different equations. It really challenged their mental arithmetic skills to see who could get the answer the quickest! In Science, we have been learning about the Earth, moon and the Sun and how their orbits affect the length of our seasons, daylight hours and months. There were lots of key facts to learn and remember!

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
