
KS2 PE Pupil Voice Survey 2021

Following a P.E pupil voice survey 97% of our children said: 'I enjoy my P.E lessons' and 'I recognise that it is important and keeps me healthy'.


Over 90% also thanked their teachers and said: 'that their teacher's clear instructions lead to their success'.

Around the Academy

This week **Reception** have shared the story 'Superworm', written by Julia Donaldson and illustrated by Axel Scheffler. This book has built upon the children's learning about rhyme and patterns within poems and stories. Superworm is such a kind and helpful friend and the story really helps develop imaginative storytelling and language. The children are immersing themselves into lots of independent writing which includes making their own non-fiction books and friendship letters to each other. In maths we have focused on doubling numbers 1-5 and have used ladybird pictures as a stimulus to support this. The children realise that the numbers need to be the same in two different groups in order to double. We are also focusing on our recognition of numbers 0-20 and seeing how quickly we can place them in the correct number order. Why don't you challenge your child to do this at home, maybe starting with numbers to 10 first? Have fun! The caterpillars in Reception have now turned into their chrysalis stage which has been fascinating for us all to watch their daily changes. There have been lots of discussions about what will happen next as well as lots of drawing and writing about our visitors. Now we are wondering how long it will be before they turn into butterflies. What do you think?

Please remember to send your child into school every day with a named water bottle that is separate to their lunchbox drink. Also, it would be helpful if your child can have a named sun hat in school each day. As the weather gets warmer please apply sun cream on your child before school. If they need a top-up of sun-cream applied during the day please teach them how to apply this themselves. Have a lovely weekend! The Reception Team

This week **Year 2** have been researching the animal of their choice. They have had to use books and the internet to find out what their animal's diet, habitat, how it entertains itself and then they had to find out an interesting fact about their animal. We also learned how to do a traditional maypole dance to music and the children experimented with keeping a beat using percussion instruments. We have been working on our learning and life skill 'I can express my opinion and give reasons for them' by talking about the animals that we like and dislike and why.

This week **Year 6** have really enjoyed writing their newspaper reports based on the Harry Potter novel, The Order of the Phoenix. They have been really creative with their ideas and vocabulary. In Science, we have been learning about the circulatory system and how it works. The children had lots of questions about the immune system and enjoyed discussing this. Last Friday, Year 6 were treated to a special live lesson via MS Teams about Passover from Mr Bermon. The children were hooked when they heard about his first hand experiences and were impressed by how knowledgeable he has.

PE News

This week, throughout the school, the children have been focusing on team games in PE. Team games are a great way for the children to demonstrate working together towards an end result. I have witnessed co-operation, patience, support and a fantastic attitude towards fair play throughout all year groups. Well done to all of our amazing children.

Whilst on the subject of team games, I would like to say a huge well done to four of our girls in year four. At the weekend they played a fantastic game of football which ended in a 5-5 draw. The girls needed lots of energy and determination to get the result against a very difficult opposition. Well done girls, I always love to hear about anything sport related, keep up the great work.
