Message from the Principal

Dear parents, carers and children,

Today I would like to take this opportunity to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of Victory in Europe Day. I am thankful to all those who have and currently serve in our armed forces and the sacrifice that men and women made and still make for us so we have brighter tomorrows. I would like to celebrate our war heroes and also those heroes supporting us through this current crisis. On the news, the nation has been celebrating the commitment of Captain Tom in serving our country in past years but also during recent months as he in turn praises the contributions of key workers today. I often say to our children to learn from the example of successful people and to dream big. Colonel Tom is a great example of someone who set himself a goal and achieved great things. And who would have thought a 100-year-old would be no 1 in the charts with a Charity song, 'You'll Never Walk Alone'.

Recently on the Queen's birthday, the Queen made reference to the war time song, 'We'll Meet Again' and NHS workers have released a charity version of the song too. We can take meaning from the lyrics of such songs, poignant at this point in time, as they were back then. Our children and staff have been reflecting on the lyrics of wartime songs and produced a version of the song, 'White Cliffs of Dover', to share with you. Our children have also been learning about VE Day and showing their creativity through producing poetry and art in commemoration. I would like to share some of their beautiful work with you. Thank you Jamie, Daisy, William, Thomas, Ronny and Grace for sharing your talents with us.

My own grandfather, Stan Fautley, loved to sing and write poetry. He served in the Royal Air Force as a member of the Halifax air crew, carrying out many missions over Germany. His love of poetry and prose enabled him to record his experiences and feelings during this time and in later years he collated these into a book called, 'Pipe Thoughts'. Having the opportunity to read his poems and short stories, gave me insight into World War Two and also his character.

My grandad's aircraft was a Halifax Bomber DY**-L** and he wrote a poem called **L** for London. He wrote the poem as a prisoner in a prisoner of war camp, 'Stalag 4B' in 1942.







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L for London

Each night our squadron takes the air, One Halifax we view with pride. The one that takes us over there; The one that bears upon her side The enemies defence in frenzy tries To stop is, but we are not tired Deep in our hearts we realise The reason why we are inspired. My grandad was a determined fellow who escaped three times from stalag 4B. He was recaptured, to be finally imprisoned in Colditz Castle - as a multiple escapee, where he stayed until the end of the war. He writes about such times in his book in shorty prose called, 'name, rank and number' and 'hole in the wall'. I am sure many of you have personal stories of those you hold dear who have served or serve in the forces and join me in saying thank you. Enjoy your celebrations this weekend and stay safe.

During recent times we have seen people coming together and sharing hope for a brighter tomorrow. We are currently awaiting Government announcements and guidance of the next phase for the country and this includes the potential reopening of schools, with reintegration planning. I know many of you will be wondering what this will look like and the plan for Darlinghurst. I will share our response with you, as soon as I can. Please be assured that when planning for the re-admittance of the children, our key drivers will be the safety of our children, families, staff and the local community. Until then we will continue to work together, as we have been and I thank you for your continued support.
