Welcome to Year 2

We are looking forward to another great half term! To enrich the children's learning about the Great Fire of London, we have a wonderful theatre group visiting us at the start of the new half term - a truly immersive event which will help children step back in time and learn about key events in history.

Core learning	In writing, we will be using our knowledge and understanding of events in the past to help us create reports written from various perspectives. We will also be writing descriptive stories set in the past. Pupils will have a Writing for Enjoyment session where they can choose the audience and purpose of their writing.
	Each week we have a reading for pleasure session where children can share their recommended reads. We have visit times to our library on a Monday when children can borrow books to read at home.
	In maths we will be covering the following areas: • Measuring length • Multiplication and division Each week we engage in TTRS/Numbots and celebrate children who have improved in both effort and speed
Skills	In skills lessons we will be engaging in lessons linked to the following areas: Musicianship and learning to sing various Christmas songs E-safety

Connected curriculum	Our focus unit this half term is called What makes us proud of our place? This is a history- based unit with connections across the curriculum. This covers the following areas: • Events in history that caused significant changes (Great Fire of London) • Where we live and locating London on a map • Significant individuals such as Samuel Pepys and Sir Christopher Wren • Historical enquiry lessons which arouse curiosity and encourage thoughtful questioning
Faith, Health and Wellbeing	During Faith and well-being lessons we will be learning about Christians and what they believe, symbols within Christianity and how Christian faith is expressed. Pupils will be exploring feelings and their sense of belonging.

Homework

Your child will bring home a homework book that includes the overview, knowledge organiser and spellings. A copy of the overview will be sent to your MCAS account.

Spellings will be tested on a Friday.





As a reading first school, we promote daily reading. Your child will bring home a book to share.





We also support children in their number recall and multiplication facts. Your child will have a log in for TTRockstars / Numbots and we encourage daily practice for at least 6 minutes a day.
