
### Message from the Principal

### **Around the Academy**

This week in **Year 1**, we have continued to be historians looking at a great day out in Victorian times and comparing these to great days out we go on nowadays. In writing, we have been using the story What the ladybird heard, writing our own creative stories, with a focus on exclamation marks and adding suffixes to a variety of words to change their meaning or tense. In Maths, we have used our previous knowledge on quarters, sharing for division and arrays to solve a selection of challenges as well as having the opportunity to develop our reasoning skills, by discussing with our talk partners, how we solved the challenge.
